General Assistance & Emergency Assistance

General Assistance (GA)

The General Assistance program is a state mandated, locally administered welfare program designed to support township residents experiencing financial hardship. General Assistance is considered to be the program of last resort. In accordance with adopted written standards, the program may provide monthly financial assistance for basic needs.

Emergency Assistance (EA)

Emergency Assistance provides financial aid to help alleviate an “emergency” or “life threatening” circumstance (i.e., eviction, utility disconnection). Emergency Assistance is not provided for security deposits, first month’s rent, hotels, or medical bills. Support is available for qualifying residents of Schaumburg Township. Emergency Assistance can be issued once in any twenty-four (24) month period. Program guidelines are established by the Welfare Services Department.

Assistance is issued by appointment only.

Other Services Provided

Access to Care: A non-profit primary health care program targeting low-income, uninsured individuals residing in suburban Cook County.

Food Pantry: Are you forced to make difficult decisions between paying the bills or purchasing groceries? If so, you are not alone. Food is available to any individual or family in need.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP): A federal program designed to assist low-income households pay for home energy.

Mobile Dental Clinic: In collaboration with Northwest Community Healthcare, Schaumburg Township offers dental services to residents who do not have access to dental care.

Residential Special Hardship Program (ComEd): Program provides a grant to income-eligible residential customers with a demonstrated hardship.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP): SNAP, formerly the Food Stamp program, is a federal program designed to help people with limited income increase their ability to purchase food. A township staff member is available to help with your application by appointment only.

CEDA Weatherization: A program designed to assist income-eligible households by reducing their heating and cooling costs and addressing health and safety issues in their homes through energy-efficiency measures.
