

## Kenneth Young Center Offers Youth Substance Abuse and Mental Health Counseling



Although recent studies point to a decline in youth substance abuse, it is still a matter that needs attention. Many youths with substance abuse problems also have underlying issues which may be the cause for their drug or alcohol use. Unfortunately, many teens who struggle with substance abuse may not see a mental health professional and therefore part of the issue remains undiagnosed.

For those who do receive a dual diagnosis, there are MISA (mental illness and substance abuse) programs available which can help adolescents cope with both concurrently.

Kenneth Young Center offers Teen MISA and Transitioning Youth MISA programs. The Teen MISA group is for adolescents in high school while the Transitioning Youth MISA group is for young adults out of high school but under the age of 26.

A primary focus of the groups is to help young clients understand how their use impacts their functioning in relationships, school, and at work. The programs also aim to help clients develop healthy coping skills in dealing with triggers, peer pressure, and emotions which may urge them to use. Learning how to manage these situations in a healthier way is vital. Discussions on various consequences, both short- and long-term, are an essential part of the MISA groups. These discussions also include helping clients see the discrepancies between their goals and future use. Another phase of treatment includes helping clients recognize the numerous stages of change and understand that relapses may occur during these stages.

Lindsey Eilers, MISA Adolescent & Transitioning Youth Therapist, explained why she felt the groups were needed, "I think the groups are important because when you put a bunch of people in a room with different experiences and perspectives, it helps others become more open-minded and invite new perspectives into their own." She further described how the effectiveness of the groups come from a client's ability to gain knowledge and insight from their peers who are going through some of the same challenges they have experienced.

### 2015 Branch Pick-up

After another harsh winter, spring has arrived bringing yard work and storm cleanup! Branch pickup will be the **first and third Mondays of the month from May through October** for residents of **Unincorporated Schaumburg Township**.

Please leave branches long and place them neatly with cut ends toward the street. Piles larger than 4 feet high by 8 feet wide, or logs, evergreen clippings, or rotten wood will not be picked up. Wood chips may be available for delivery.



### Drainage

Please be good neighbors and clear debris from your drainage swales. Water will need time to subside as it can sometimes overwhelm drainage systems.

### Cook County Building and Zoning Changes and Elgin O'Hare Western Access

Changes were made recently to Cook County Building and Zoning. Any property in Unincorporated Cook County that goes under contract is required to obtain a Zoning Certificate in order to verify its current zoning classification, any outstanding building permits, and [any] outstanding violations or judgements on said property prior to closing. A fee of \$100 is charged for this service. Zoning Certificate applications are available online at [cookcountyil.gov/building-and-zoning](http://cookcountyil.gov/building-and-zoning).

## A Message from Assessor John R. Lawson, M.S., C.I.A.O.

### Senior Exemptions

For 2014, persons ages 65 and older and born in 1949 or earlier, may qualify to receive one or more exemptions on their property tax bill. Seniors may be eligible to receive the Homeowner Exemption, Senior Exemption, and/or Senior Freeze. All eligible exemptions you apply for will result in a deduction on your second installment property tax bill that will be issued in July 2015 by the Cook County Treasurer's Office.



### Exemptions/Tax Bill

The Cook County Treasurer's Office will mail the second installment property tax bill the first week in July 2015 that will be due the first week in August 2015. Call the Schaumburg Township Assessor's office at (847) 884-0030 before the July mailing date to check the application status for exemptions you applied for. Be sure to review your bill for any errors and to ensure all eligible exemptions are listed. If any exemptions you applied for are not listed, it will affect your property tax bill and/or mortgage payment.

### Appeal Dates for 2015

Schaumburg Township residents can check the Cook County Assessor's website, [cookcountyassessor.com](http://cookcountyassessor.com), for the tentative date for filing an appeal. Residents can appeal their property assessment in late summer through early fall of 2015. Appeals are open for a 30-day period only. Those who file successful tax appeals will see the exemption applied to the second installment property tax bill in August 2016. Those who filed successful tax appeals for 2014 will see the exemption applied to the second installment property tax bill due in August 2015. Once the second installment of property tax bill is mailed, it is too late to appeal the assessment on this bill.

### Coffee with the Assessor

Started September 2011, Coffee with the Assessor assists in initiating a dialogue with township residents to address property tax related issues, questions, and the appeal process. It allows residents within Schaumburg Township to host a "town hall" style meeting in their home for 10 to 20 guests. ■

Schaumburg Township is hosting a Community Shred & Electronics Recycling Day Saturday, June 6, 9 AM – 12 PM. This free event is available to Schaumburg Township residents only. Businesses will not be allowed. Paper shredding is limited up to 4 boxes (1 cubic feet or 15" x 12" x 10"). Paper clips, staples and rubber bands do not need to be removed. Electronics recycling will accept computer/IT equipment, cell phones, home and office electronics. Other items such as household batteries or kitchen appliances are not accepted. There is a \$20 charge to dispose CRT monitors and tube TVs and must be paid by cash or check.
