

**MEDICARE PART C/D OPEN ENROLLMENT
October 15 - December 7, 2019**

The Medicare Part C and D Open enrollment Period is October 15 - December 7. This is a good time to review, change, join or cancel your part C (Advantage) or Part D plans. Any changes to your plan will be in effect January 1, 2020. You do not have to change your plan, but it is recom-

mended to check if another plan for next year could be more beneficial for you.

Sarita Phadke is a SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) Counselor and she can help you with information and assistance with the following: Medicare Part D, Medicare Supplemental Insurance, Medicare Advantage Plans (Part C), Medicare Savings Programs (Medicaid, QMB, SLMB) for people with Medicare, Extra Help, etc. If you would like to evaluate your options, or want to change to a different Medicare plan, or Medicare Part D, please contact Sarita to make an appointment: sphadke@schaumburgtownship.org or 224-520-9763 VP.

** New this year, you will have to create an online account with mymedicare.gov for personalized options. We can assist you if needed.



LIHEAP PROGRAM

The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides financial assistance to help those with limited income pay their utility bills (electricity and gas). This program is administered by CEDA.

Enrollment dates:

- Starting October 1st - Seniors age 60+ or people with disabilities
- Starting November 1st - Families with children under the age of 6 years or with disconnection
- Starting December 1st - Open to all income-eligible households

Documents Required:

- 2019 Social Security Benefit Letter (all pages)
- Social Security cards for every member of the household
- Most recent utility bills - Nicor and ComEd
- Proof of gross monthly income for every household member - paycheck stubs, unemployment, pensions, TANF, child support, etc., 30 days before your appointment date
- Income Guidelines: 1 person - \$1,561; 2 people - \$2,114; 3 people - \$2,666; 4 people - \$3,219

TELEPHONE CHECK-IN PROGRAM

HOLIDAY ADOPTION PROGRAM

The winter season is quickly approaching! If you are in the Township and are in need this holiday season, we invite you to apply for our Holiday Adoption program for persons with disabilities. This program provides specialized care packages from community donations. To qualify, your income needs to be less than \$1,561 for a single household and \$2,114 for a two-person household. Special circumstances will also be considered. To apply, you must meet with a staff member between October 1st and October 25th. We cannot guarantee that all applicants will be selected. COLD & FLU SEASON

The cold and flu season is right around the corner. To fight off those germs, here are some healthy habits to help prevent flu:

- ◆ Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to prevent them from getting sick too.

- ◆ Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose or mouth.
- ◆ Practice other good health habits - Clean & disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, specially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.
- ◆ Get a flu shot.





National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

October is the month of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Except for skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women. Every 13 minutes, one woman in the U.S. will lose her life to breast cancer. Breast cancer in men is rare, but it does happen. 1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime.

Breast cancer screening means checking a woman's breasts for cancer before she has any symptoms. A mammogram is an X-ray picture of the breast. Mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms.




